This is a unique opportunity to have an officer assigned to you for an agreed period and who will provide direct assistance to your group including supporting you to seek grant aid. The offer is based on free one-to-one assistance to interested groups under the following headings

Climate Change/Environmental projects 2022

Rural Villages Support 2022

New, Rejuvenated and Smaller groups 2022

Health and Well-being Projects 2022

CWSAN's offer of free one-to-one assistance to Climate Change/Environmental Projects 2022

CWSAN, as an organisation, has a vision of a more sustainable environment within rural Mid Ulster. To this end we are seeking to support up to 6 local, member, rural or village communities to think about climate change and to do something positive locally through an environmental project or series of projects.

We are offering hands on assistance to these 6 groups to challenge your local community to act locally, thinking globally and to seek funding to develop a small project in your community.

We will work with you over time on an application/s to relevant community climate change and other environmental funds and will assist you ensure that the governance required by the funders is in place to support a successful grant application.

This is a one-off opportunity for our rural members to get hands on direct assistance around these types of applications to relevant funders.

We intend to accept a declaration of interest from those local group members across the district who best-fit the funders criteria and whom have a proven track record of community development capacity, networking and project delivery.

CWSAN offer of free one-to-one assistance to Rural Villages 2022

CWSAN seeks to work with an additional six local Villages (less than 5000 population) from its membership from across Mid Ulster in 2022 with the aim of assisting develop better networking and relevant projects for that village.

We are presently able to support closely an additional six local rural village communities, bringing together various representative groups within the village and its hinterland to develop a local project/s which will be of support to the local community.

There are over forty villages recognised by the Rural Development Programme and/or Mid Ulster District Council and we will be selecting six from this cohort in addition to those we are currently working with.

We are offering hands-on assistance to these village groups to review their community/village plans, seek support locally for an agreed project and to seek funding to develop these plans for their village and community.

We will work with you over time and will assist you ensure that the governance required by the various funders is in place to support a successful grant application. Our officers have lots of experience in working with networked and village groups and in successfully attracting both small and large grants to rural areas. If successful, you will be assigned an officer for a set duration.

This is a one-off opportunity for our rural members to get hands on direct assistance around your village plans, to be part of community planning and to convince relevant funders of the importance of your village applications.

We intend to accept a declaration of interest from those local groups in villages across the district who best-fit the funders criteria and whom have a proven track record of community development capacity, networking and project delivery.

CWSAN's offer of free one-to-one assistance to New, Rejuvenated and to Smaller groups

In order to better sustain community activity throughout rural Mid Ulster, CWSAN is seeking to support up to 6 relatively new, recently rejuvenated or small local rural community groups to work closely with them to adequately prepare for the delivery of smaller scale projects.

We are offering hands on assistance to these 6 groups and will work with you over an agreed period of time developing your good governance, reviewing committee skills, supporting charitable activity, reviewing Community planning, forward planning, project planning, making successful applications for grant aid and delivering on successful grant applications.

This is a one-off opportunity in 2022 for rural groups to get hands on direct assistance to any new or rejuvenated groups and/or to smaller community organisations. If successful, you will be assigned an officer for an agreed duration of time.

We intend to accept a declaration of interest from those local group members across the district who have had little or no experience with applications or with grant/project delivery but whom are willing to start from the beginning and develop their community development capacity for project activities in their own locality.

We intend to accept a declaration of interest from those local group members across the district who best-fit the funders criteria and whom have a proven track record of community development capacity, networking and project delivery.
